

ADA Service Animal

"Service animal means any dog that is individually trained to do work or perform tasks for the benefit of an individual with a disability, including a physical, sensory, psychiatric, intellectual or other mental disability."

Companion Animals

A "companion animal" is a pet that is owned by an individual with a disability. A companion animal is NOT a service animal and unlike service animals, companion animals will not need to accompany the individual with the disability at all times.

1.Please provide <u>specific evidence</u> that the disability results in a functional limitation requiring an assistance animal.
