
# **Board of Regents Update**

The Board of Regents for the Montana University System met in Missoula Thursday & Friday to discuss and act on a number of issues including a long discussion of the newly proposed Bitterroot Valley Community College (BVCC). There was lengthy testimony before the board by the supporters of the new community college. The Board office, OCHE, prepared a 184 page report with information and questions about the proposal. On Dec. 4th, the Regents will discuss and act on the BVCC request.

MSU-Northern submitted and received approval of faculty emeritus status for Robert Miller, Robert Christeck, and Lloyd Stallkamp. In addition, academic Program Reviews (within the normal cycle) for Northern and other campuses were reviewed. The Board spent considerable time discussing the Governor's Office Budget proposal for the upcoming session. State Budget Director David Ewer, was present and commented on recent trends in state revenue projections and the potential effects for the upcoming legislative session.

Beginning at 7:00 AM on Saturday, November 22, 2008, all Banner services will be unavailable until 2:00 PM. Upgrades to the server room electrical system will take place from 8AM to about 11AM followed by upgrades to Banner - Luminis Integration Components (INTCOMP) and Learning Management Gateway (LMG) until about 2:00 PM. The services which will be unavailable include both the Banner production and test development systems, including: the Banner databases, Internet Native Forms (INF), and Banner Web self service, (MyInfo), and the Luminis Portal (MyPortal).

# **Computer Tips**

**Hide the Ribbon in Excel 2007**

**Navigating Through Your Word 2007 Document** 

When you're working on a long document, it is easy to lose your place. And you can spend a lot of time scrolling through your document to find a particular section. In Word 2007, there is an easy way to navigate through your document: You can turn on the "Thumbnails" view.

With Thumbnails view, you'll see small pictures of each page of your document. While the thumbnails are too small to read, you'll see the general layout of the pages, including pictures and other objects. Also, each thumbnail is numbered, so you can easily jump to a specific page.

When you click on a thumbnail, Word will automatically open that page in the main document area. To open the Thumbnails view, open the **View** tab. Then, in the **Show/Hide** section, select **Thumbnails**.

On the left side of the screen, a pane will open containing thumbnails of your document's pages. To close the thumbnails pane just click the X at the top of the pane.
