

Computer Corner

Excel Tip:

Reclaim space in Microsoft Excel by changing text alignment If you have a spreadsheet that doesn't quite fit on your screen - you have to scroll horizontally - you might be able to reclaim some space by angling the header text. This method works best when you have column header labels that are considerably longer than the actual data.

You can angle the headings as follows:

- 1. Select the header cells to be angled.
- 2. Right-click the selection and choose Format Cells.
- 3. Click the **Alignment** tab. By default, the **Degree orientation** is 0%.
- Change the Degree setting to 65. Between 45 and 85 usually yields the best results. The highest setting is 90. Lower settings require a larger column width.
- 5. Click **OK**.

Finish by adjusting the cell widths and, if necessary the row height, to condense the display.

This past weekend several Northern Alumni had much success at the Montana High School State Wrestling Tournaments. Ted Hill, Head coach for the Laurel Locomotives, lead his team to the State Class A title, knocking off the Havre Blue Ponies who's Head Coach is Scott Filius. Filius was a two-time All-American (1990 & 1991) for Northern and was a National Champion in 1991. The Blue Ponies were the four-time defending state Class A champions and finished in second place this year. In 1990 Filius earned Academic All-American status. Ted Hill was a two-time All-American and a two-time Academic All-American in 1996 and 1997.

The Class AA state champions, Bozeman Hawks, were guided by former Northern wrestler Nate Laslovich. Steve French who was a two-time All-American and two-time Academic All-American led Choteau-Augusta to a second place finish at the State B-C wrestling Tournament. Yet, another former Northern wrestler, Lonnie Robertson, guided Billings Senior to a fourth place state finisher. Former two-time All-American and National Champion, Mike Leinwand officiated the state wrestling tournament this past weekend.
