#### 2. Service

A person who has held an important position, published material, made an important discovery or invention, made a contribution to an academic field, or has given significant direction or service to MSU-Northern for a minimum of 25 years, particularly if he/she is or was an alumnus, faculty, staff, or administrator of Northern

### 3. Financial

A person who gave direct financial contribution to the University Foundation, or Alumni Association for buildings, scholarships, research, faculty development, program development, etc.

## Student Union Building's 50th Anniversary

The Associated Students of MSU-Northern are hosting a 50th Anniversary Party for MSU-Northern's Student Union Building.

In 1958 the plans were being drawn up for a new Student Union Building on the campus. The entire cost of the structure was to be borne by students and financed by increased fees authorized by the students themselves. Max Kuhr of Havre was appointed the architect for the building. Built in almost the same location as the original Student Union Building, it was ready for use in 1961.

The new building has a large ballroom and a smaller adjoining open space, an attractive fireside room and lounge, bookstore space, new offices and a snack bar. A smaller second floor houses conference rooms and additional office space. A large basement allowed room for the development of recreational facilities. These were added in 1964. ### Word 2007/2010 Tip Convert Table to Text

A Word table is a great tool for organizing related data but sometimes you may want to take the information in the table convert it to text. To do this:

- 1. Select the rows or entire table that you want to convert to text.
- Under Table Tools, on the Layout tab, in the Data group, click Convert to Text.
  - (note: the **Table Tools** will only show up when you have selected a table or your cursor is in a table)
- 3. Under **Separate text** with, click the option for the separator character that you want to use in place of the column boundaries. Rows will be separated with paragraph marks.
- 4. Click OK.

In conjunction with the "50 year birthday" celebration of the Student Union Building (SUB) coming up on October 13, 2011, here are some interesting SUB facts. The initial cost of the building was approximately \$289,000.00. In 2007 it was determined that the replacement cost of the SUB was 4.4 million dollars (that is more than 15 times the original cost). The Student Union Building has more than 29,000 square feet. These numbers do not include the Food Service area, as it was added on in 1971. The SUB was only 10 years old when Janice Brady started working at Northern.
