MSU-Northern Instructors Learn Rescue Techniques



In the final week of September, MSU-Northern's Sustainable Energy Technology Instructor Ed Bonjokian and Industrial Technology Instructor Jeff Hildebrandt traveled to MSU-Great Falls for Work at Height and Wind Turbine Generator Rescue Training. The week long training program, presented by Altezza a world leader in height safety training, provided instruction on various rescue techniques and emergency scenarios found in the wind industry. Although safety is a very serious matter in the wind industry, much of the training is similar to extreme sports.

The instructors learned the proper methods to rescue injured workers on ladders, inside turbine nacelles, and from the top of the turbines. There was also instruction on nacelle evacuations, rappelling, and equipment care. The skills they learned are now being taught in the classroom at MSU-Northern.

"It was the most intense and exhausting week of training I have ever experienced and I am excited to bring this knowledge back to my students," said Ed Bonjokian. "We work hard to keep our program up to date with the latest developments in the wind industry, and this course has improved my knowledge of the most important aspect of the industry: safety."

One of MSU-Northern's newest programs, Sustainable Energy Technology offers a one year certificate, and a two year Associates of Science degree. The College of Technical Science is also developing a four year program in Sustainable Energy with a Management and Technology options.

"The wind and sustainable energy industries offer some of the most dynamic career opportunities for our students, both locally and worldwide" notes the 2nd year instructor. "There are over 16,000 companies, employing over a million people around the globe and those numbers grow every year."
