Multi-Cultural Presentation on Higher Education for Indian Students

During faculty and staff in service orientation, Reno Charette, MSU-Billings Director of American Indian Outreach presented her conference, "Sees the Circled Rainbow: What Higher Education Could Be For

Indian Students." In this interactive presentation, she discussed how all staff and faculty in a higher education institution can empower students by meeting their needs and setting them up for success. She examined the following topics from an Indian point of view: how education can be a welcoming place for American Indians and for indigenous scholarship, how higher education institutions could be places that include American Indian role models and leaders, how these institutions can provide reliable financial support, how college could be a place of social and cultural support and cultural competence, how Indian alumni should be valued, and how higher education could be a place of distinction for American Indians. The moral of her recommendations was to guide students by building on their strengths and not focusing on their pitfalls.

Charette has an extensive history of work in higher education. She formerly served as Governor Brian Schweitzer's Coordinator of Indian Affairs. She was the project coordinator for the Big Horn Teacher Project at MSU-Billings in addition of serving as the project coordinator for the Health Careers Opportunity Program in the School of Pharmacy at the University of Montana.


