Dr. Campbell Joins MSU-Northern Team

Dr. Margarett Campbell is the new Director of Indian Education/Tribal Liaison and Special Advisor to the Chancellor at MSU-Northern. In this new position, Dr. Campbell will be responsible for delivering and facilitating professional development for campus faculty and staff, specifically in the areas of cultural responsiveness and Montana's Indian Education, for All Act, as part of the Little River Institute (NASNTI grant). Dr. Campbell will also serve as a tribal liaison for MSU-Northern, facilitating relationships and collaborations with our nearby tribal communities and tribally controlled community colleges. Dr. Campbell will serve as special advisor to the Chancellor, a role that will benefit MSU-Northern as a whole given her education, extensive experience in higher education, and familiarity with our campus.

Dr. Margarett Campbell is a graduate of Montana State University-Northern where she received three degrees, an A.S. Business Administration, B.S. Business Education and M.Ed. in Vocational Education. Dr. Campbell went on to receive a Doctorate in Education from the University of Montana in



May 2003. Additionally, she was recognized with the UM Leadership Excellence Award in 2009 and most recently received the Founder's Excellence Award from MSU-N in May 2017.

Lights Basketball Team Goes Head to Head with the Bobcats

The Lights took on their "parent school" Nov. 1st, in an exhibition game vs Montana State University, and made quite a showing against their D1 opponent. The Lights were leading at halftime after a three-pointer by Sophomore guard Adam Huse, 39-38, Northern kept the battle close, coming up just short in the end, 73-78. Picked fourth out of 12 teams in the Big Sky Conference, MT State had all they could handle vs our Lights

from the NAIA Frontier Conference. Huse and Senior Center Ryan Reeves each lead the way with 13 points, Sophomore Devin Bray had 12, and Juniors Caulin Bakalarski & Gabe Porter each chipped in 10. Reeves also garnered nine rebounds in the evening. The Lights are currently 3-0 and travel to a very tough tournament next weekend to face NAIA DII nationally ranked opponents #17 Oregon Tech on Friday and #11 Southern Oregon on Saturday. Says Huse about their game with the Bobcats and the season ahead: "We were very proud of our guys, how tough they played, and how well they seem to be gelling early on this year. We were very grateful to MSU for the opportunity to play them down there and now must keep pressing on as we have a long ways to go. Our guys know this game was exciting, but also that it was just the tip of the iceberg. They understand there is a great deal of work left to do if we are going to make some real noise once again this season."

Big Show of MSUN Alumni and Employees at 47th Annual Havre Art Show

The Havre Art Association hosted its 47th annual Art Show at the Van Orsdel United Methodist Church, where 21 artists from the Hi-Line displayed their artwork.
