New Jail Cell for Criminal Justice Program

The Criminal Justice Program at MSU-Northern has added a small 5'x5' jail cell to its program. The cell will be used to allow students to participate in hands-on arrest procedures. Students can be placed in the cell and then discuss the psychological impact of sensory deprivation. Even for the short time a person is in the cell, they can get a glimpse into the world of an inmate. It gives the students a small taste of the criminal justice system, whether as a police officer, correctional officer, or probation - parole officer. There are many instances where they will be using the cell for experience and discussion. Tiffany Slattery's welding class built the jail cell last semester and several criminal justice students finished the project.

Book Club: I Tituba, Black Witch of Salem - Feb. 26

In celebration of African-American History Month in February, the English Department and the Office of Diversity Awareness and Multicultural Programs (ODAMP) are sponsoring the book conversation on this novel written by Maryse Condé. This historical fiction novel was originally published in French in 1986, but it was translated into English in 1992. It won the French Grand Prix award for women's literature. *I Tituba, Black Witch of Salem,* is about the life of Titubal, a biracial girl born in Barbados to a young slave woman and an English sailor. She is an orphan who grows with an old spiritual herbalist named Mama Yaya. Tituba soon gets involved in the Salem Witch Trials, a situation that only sets her up for more hectic events in her life. The conversation will take place Tuesday, February 27, 2018, at 5.00 p.m. at the Multicultural Center, Cowan Hall 308.

I would like to highlight Northern Alumni Jacob "Buck" Turcotte. Buck is an English teacher and coach at Frazer Public High School. As I mentioned last month in a previous TidBit, Frazer is a small community down the road about 190 miles to the east from MSU-Northern and Havre. Buck graduated from Northern with a Bachelor's degree in Secondary Education: English and a minor in HPE. Two years ago, Buck started the wrestling program at Frazer High School. Last summer Coach Turcotte hosted The Bearcub Wrestling Camp that featured the Eastern Oregon University's coaching staff, Head Coach, Dustyn Azure (Northern Alumni), and Assistant Coach, Ty Vinson. This past season his son, William Turcotte, became the first Frazer "Bearcub" to place at a MHSA sanctioned wrestling tournament, by placing third at the Malta

Mustang Invitational. William Turcotte was voted the Great Falls Tribune male athlete of the week for the week of February 11, 2018.
