Over 2000 people came out to Tilleman Field on Saturday, August 28, to enjoy the first home football game of the season. Saturday's game marked a momentous occasion for the Northern community, since it was the first game to be fully open to the public. Fans were overjoyed to have their first opportunity to participate in the excitement created by having a home football game on the MSU-Northern campus, on the brand-new field.

When the Lights stormed the field, they were led by three horses ridden by members of the Northern rodeo team, who each held a flag. The stands erupted into cheers and the excitement in the air was palpable as fans waited with anticipation to see the first game of the season get underway. At many moments during the game, the fans took advantage of the new metal bleachers, stomping their feet and getting loud to let the Lights know they had their loyal fans behind them.

At halftime, the donors who made phase one of the football stadium project a reality were brought onto the field to be honored. Their names were read from a list, one-by-one, as they received recognition and applause for helping bring a long-held community dream to life. Though this was just the first game to be open to the public, the entire campus and community looks forward to continuing to host game day experiences right here at home, on the MSU-Northern campus.

New MSU-Northern COVID Guidelines


COVID is still present in our community so to help us reduce the risk of COVID and the highly contagious Delta variant we want everyone to follow these simple guidelines:

- We strongly encourage everyone to get vaccinated. Contact Student Health Services for the latest information on how to get vaccinated
- Cannot require mask use but masks protect yourself and others
- Disposable masks are available all over campus
- Social distancing is encouraged
- Cleaning and sanitizing helps reduce the spread
- Open windows to decrease disease transmission
- Stay home if you have symptoms and get tested
- Hill County Health Department will conduct contact tracing
- Those who test positive will be isolated
- The County Health Department will determine who is to be isolated or quarantined
- Academic help will be available to students in quarantine
- Student Affairs will coordinate other services as needed

Mamma Mia - Sept. 10-12, 16-18, 23-25








#342 Do you like trivia?
