MSU-Northern Honors Constitution Day



Constitution Day commemorates the formation and signing of the U.S. Constitution by thirty-nine brave men on September 17, 1787, recognizing all who are born in the U.S. or by naturalization, have become citizens. The MSU-Northern Library honored Constitution Day with free cookies and pocket-sized copies of the U.S. Constitution.

The Constitution of the United States of America is the supreme law of the United States. It is the foundation and source of the legal authority underlying the existence of the United States of America and the Federal Government of the United States. It provides the framework for the organization of the United States Government. The document defines the three main branches of the government: The legislative branch with a bicameral Congress, an executive branch led by the President, and a judicial branch headed by the Supreme Court. Besides providing for the organization of these branches, the Constitution outlines obligations of each office, as well as provides what powers each branch may exercise. It also reserves numerous rights for the individual states, thereby establishing the United States' federal system of government.

QPR Suicide Prevention Training - Sept. 28

QPR (Question, Persuade, and Refer) is an evidence-based training that teaches participants to recognize the warning signs of suicide and how to question, persuade, and refer someone to help. Similar to CPR, QPR is an emergency mental health intervention meant for anyone to learn skills to help save lives.

Two sessions are scheduled (you only need to attend one). Staff, Faculty, Students and community members are all welcome to attend. 
TekNoXpo & ShowCASE - Oct. 7



Tidbit Time Machine Fall 1971

In conjunction with Homecoming 2021, let's go back 50 years and check out what NMC Homecoming was like in 1971.

There were 8 candidates for Homecoming Queen and from of the Wednesday, October 27, 1971, edition of the NoMoCo here are those candidates;





On Thursday, October 28, prior to the Jimmy Webb concert at the Armory Gymnasium, Sue Korman was crowned Homecoming Queen. Sue was a sophomore elementary education major from Saco, Montana. Here is her official portrait from the *Northerner* Yearbook!

There were multiple other events going on that week and here is clip of the events that week that was published in the Wednesday, October 13, 1971, edition of the NoMoCo:

SCHEDULE OF EVENTS: Thursday, October 28 --7:30--Crowning of Homecoming Queen 8:00 -- Jimmy Webb Concert Following Jimmy Webb Concert-NON-GRUBB dance in the SUB. Friday, October 29 --Dusk -- dummy burning behind Math-Science Building followed by the Snake Dance to Buttreys, Grubb dance in Sub. Saturday, October 30 --10--Parade (see notes of interest) 1:30 -- Northern Lights vs. Rocky Mountain Bears 4:30 -- Mini-concert in SUB presented by the Northern Sons.

In case you were wondering about the football game, the Northern Lights were leading Rocky Mountain College 16-2 in the final quarter but ended up with a tie of 16-16.

Going back the to the Jimmy Webb concert. That name may sound familiar to many as he is the songwriter for "Up, Up, and Away" that was a hit in 1967 for The 5th Dimension. In which he received a Grammy Award. Jimmy also wrote three of Glen Campbells's biggest hits, "By the Time I Get to Phoenix", "Wichita Lineman," and "Galveston." In 1986 Jimmy Webb was inducted into the Songwriters Hall of Fame and in 1990 he was inducted into the Nashville Songwriters Hall of Fame.
