Lights Celebrate a Historic Win



Tilleman Field was definitely the place to be Saturday (Oct. 23) as the enthusiastic campus and community helped cheer the lights football team on to a 22-20 victory over Eastern Oregon University.

"It just shows the resilience of this team. Anyone could have given up right there, not this team. This team is tough. This team's resilient," MSU-Northern head football coach Andrew Rolin said. "Nothing in our past had anything to do with today and I told them you show up and do your job and the rest will take care of itself and they did it today."

This game was one for the history books in three ways. First, it was the first win for Northern on their new Tilleman Field. Secondly, this win broke a long losing streak and lastly, to our knowledge, this was the first time in Northern's football history that the Lights have gone into five overtimes.

Governor Gianforte Visits Campus



Montana Governor Greg Gianforte was on campus Wednesday (Oct. 26) to see firsthand the completed DTC. The last time he was on campus, the DTC was still under construction. He and some of his administrative assistants were able to talk about education and the role colleges and universities can play in Montana's ongoing economic development. He complimented Chancellor Kegel on Northern's practical programs, the impact Northern's grads are having on the Montana economy. He wished more of the universities were like Northern.

Gianforte spent his entire career focusing on creating jobs and opportunities. He founded five different startup companies. He's worked to improve Montana's economy through the "Better Montana Jobs" project. He also launched scholarship programs to help low-income students and veterans pursue the education and training they need to start a career in Montana.

MAT Holds Auditions for A Christmas Carol



Montana Actor's Theatre (MAT) conducted their auditions for *A Christmas Carol* on Tuesday and Wednesday nights (Oct.26-27). MAT will be presenting *A Christmas Carol* this December with all characters being Bunraku puppets. During the auditions, people were divided into groups of three and given the opportunity to experiment with how to animate a puppet. Each puppet requires three actors to operate. Therefore, this will be a very large show as they need at least 30 people!

Northern Receives \$15,000 PATH Scholarship to Support Students



MSU-Northern has been awarded \$15,000 from The Progress, Accomplishment, Thriving, Hope (PATH) Scholarship, which is provided by the Ellucian Foundation. Established in

2020, the PATH Scholarship provides grants to higher education institutions to support students facing economic hardship.

The PATH Scholarship awards block grants between \$10,000 and \$25,000 (USD) to higher education institutions to help students cover items such as

housing, tuition, and food. Individual students receive a maximum award of \$1,500 (USD) with limited exceptions.

24-Hour Play Festival - Nov. 5-6





#350 Remembering Steve Helmbrecht

Last week the Hi-Line, Havre, and Northern lost one of its finest, Mr. Steve Helmbrecht. Over the years, Steve wove his life into the into the heart and soul of Northern, Havre, and the Hi-Line. One did not have to go far to see the impact that he made. You could always count on a friendly smile, hello, and a conversation. Steve's passion for art and the community he treasured were evident in his life's work and hobbies. In addition to his photography skills, pottery/ceramics was a large part of Steve's life and service to Havre.

In 1997, Steve made and donated approximately 250 bowls to the Havre "Feed My Sheep Soup Kitchen" for a chili fundraiser and then did it again in 1999. The August 24, 1999, edition of the Havre Daily News stated, "Helmbrecht spent a total of about 250 hours making the bowls..." Keep in mind this was for one fundraiser utilizing his pottery skills and he did this for multiple organizations over the years, including in 2020 for the Havre Dog Park.


Here are some pictures of Steve Helmbrecht's ceramic skills and some of the organizations that he supported through his ceramic skills:




As was pointed out by Bear Paw Development, Steve served in the Montana legislature. He was elected to the Montana House of Representatives on November 5⁻¹⁹⁷⁴, representing District 8. The November 6th, 1974, edition of the Havre Daily News stated, "Helmbrecht won over Republican Dick Schafer, 1,454 to 765." In his attempt to keep his constituents informed, Steve would have updates in the Havre Daily News like the one here from the January 31st,1975, edition of the Havre Daily News. Steve served in this position for two years.

In 1990 Steve Helmbrecht was elected president of the Montana Professional Photographers Association. As the May 18th, 1990, Havre Daily newsstated that was 35 years after his father, Vern Helmbrecht, held the same position.
