MT INBRE awards MSU-Northern's Advanced Fuels Center \$60,000 Grant to Help Underground Mine Workers



Randy Maglinao and his co-investigators, Tony Gryffin and Keith Richardson, were recently awarded \$60,000 of grant funding by the Montana INBRE (IDeA Network of Biomedical Research Excellence) program to research ways to improve methods in protecting the health of underground mine workers from harmful diesel exhaust emission exposure. The grant will allow the team to determine the composition of diesel exhaust emissions from alternative fuels and at what conditions it is formed. The funding will also help identify the barriers in motivating mine workers to adhere to changes in health and safety protocols.

Northern Appreciation SpotLIGHT






This week the MSU-Northern

Cascade Wrestling Conference - Feb. 18-19

This weekend MSU-Northern will host the 2022 Cascade Collegiate Conference Men's Wrestling Championship. The teams who will be competing this weekend are: Arizona Christian, Corban, Eastern Oregon, Embry Riddle, Life Pacific, Menlo, MSU-Northern, Providence, Simpson, Southern Oregon, Vanguard, and Warner Pacific. The competition will begin on Friday at 12 noon and 10 a.m. on Saturday. Admission to the competition costs \$20/per day or \$30 for both days. Championship Round will begin at 5:00 pm on Saturday, tickets for that round are \$10 and \$8 if an all-day or all session pass has not been purchased.

Spring 2022 Brown Bag Lecture Series – Feb. 22 "Beyond Numbers: The Algebra of Symmetry," by Dr. Casey Donoven

MSU-Northern will be kicking off its Spring 2022 Brown Bag Lecture Series on Tuesday, February 22, with a presentation by Dr. Casey Donoven, MSU-N Assistant Professor of Mathematics. The event will be held from 1:00 to 2:00 pm in Hagener Science 101 (the Pit), and it is open to the public.

In his presentation, "Beyond Numbers: The Algebra of Symmetry," Dr. Donoven will be sharing insights from his algebra research and showing how he uses these insights to connect with students about math in different ways: "To most people, math is about numbers and learning to solve for x. The world of mathematics stretches far beyond this, however. As opposed to simply adding and multiplying numbers, algebra can describe how to combine words, compose symmetries, and much more. Math can be intimidating, but I hope to make this a fun, understandable presentation on mathematics beyond numbers."

Originally from Kremlin, Dr. Donoven has a BS in Mathematics from Montana State University and a PhD in Mathematics from the University of St. Andrews in Scotland. He held positions in Bristol, England, and Binghamton, New York, before returning to the Hi-Line.

MSU-Northern's Brown Bag Lectures are open to the public and are designed to share some of the exciting academic work happening on campus. The series is organized by the MSU-N Instruction, Research, & Faculty Development committee, in partnership with the Office of Teaching & Learning Excellence, and is sponsored by the Office of the Provost. Additional lectures this spring will include presentations by faculty in Criminal Justice in March and Diesel Technology in April.


#358 The Northern Time Machine

The directory also had a classified advertising section. Here is the first page of the 1961-62 directory. Sixty years ago, Havre had eight automotive dealers. One in particular, Runkel Bros, was located at 336 2nd street, which is now Crawford Distillery.
