#### Dr. Kaercher Awarded Grant to Advance Clay Sourcing Research in Iraqi Kurdistan



MSU-Northern's Assistant Professor of Biology and General Science, Dr. Kyra Kaercher, has been awarded a grant to spearhead a groundbreaking project focused on gathering and studying clay samples across the Erbil Plain in Iraqi Kurdistan. The grant, valued at \$6000, marks the inception of a new endeavor aimed at revolutionizing the understanding of ceramics production and distribution in the region.

This project, the first of its kind, aims to address a significant gap in existing research methodologies. While previous studies have utilized geological maps and chemical testing of ceramics to identify manufacturing locations, these

methods have proven insufficiently precise. Kyra Kaercher's pioneering initiative seeks to overcome this challenge by conducting comprehensive sampling of clay sources across the Erbil Plain.

## Read with Us! Poetry at the Library – April 18



### (#412) Joan Jett and the Blackhearts

Going back 39 years ago this week (April 2, 1985) Joan Jett and the Blackhearts performed on the NMC campus at the Armory Gymnasium. In the Fall of 1984, Central Board (Student Senate) and the Student Activities Board started planning for a

concert that would bring in a well-known act. It was reported by several that the final two groups considered were Joan Jett and the Blackhearts and Huey Lewis and the News. As we all know. Joan Jett was selected.

This was in the April 1<sup>st</sup>, 1985, NoMoCo.

# Joan Jett and the Blackhearts **Concert tomorrow night**

Jett and the Blackhearts concert, Tuesday, April 2. Tickets can be purchased at the Student Life Desk, Listen Rekerds.

The concert will start off with "Rail" The Blackhearts. The NMC concert is a part of their first U.S. tour in over a year.

Their latest album, GLORIOUS RESULTS OF A MISSPENT YOUTH.

Tickets are still available for the Joan represents a growth of their talent but retains the sound that the Blackhearts are known for.

The concert is being sponsored by the Inn, Northern Electronics and Rickey's Student Activities Board with the backing of the ASNMC Central Board.

Ticket prices are \$9 for students, \$11 and rock into the sound of Joan Jett and for general admission and \$13 at the door. The concert starts at 7:30 p.m.

It should be noted that alcoholic beverages are not permitted and will be confiscated at the door.

1985 Northerner (College Yearbook) Editor Tammie Pursley had the opportunity to interview Joan Jett and her band and here is her article that appeared in the 1985 Northerner.

"Joan Jett and the Blackhearts rocked and tolled the Armory Gym on April 2<sup>nd</sup>, 1985. Rail (shown on the opposite page) performed before Joan Jett and her band. The crowd was excited and ready to get down and boogie. And that they did clapping their hands, stomping their feet, and moving to every tune played.

In an interview before the concert. Joan and her ban gave the interviewers a little insight into their lives.

Joan was born in Phily and lived in Baltimore for a while. When she was around 12 or 13, she wanted a guitar. Her parents gave her one and after two lessons she grew tired of folk music. She started working or playing rock and

roll music instead. She then headed on to California and ended up working with the Run-A-Ways, the Sex Pistols, and other bands, including her current one.

The Blackhearts consist of Gary, Lee, and Ricky. Gary at one time lived in Glasgow, Montana. He plays bass and met up with Joan in Hollywood in 1980. Lee is the drummer and met up with Joan in August of 1980. He has worked with such groups as People and New York Dolls. Ricky joined in 1981 and is a "seasoned" guitar player.

Joan said that the past musicians that had influence her were British Glitter, Chuck Barry, and the Rolling Stones.

After leaving Havre, they were headed to Texas, Europe, and Japan."




The April 18, 1985, NoMoCo reported that around 1,500 students and community members attended the concert.
