

ARTICULATION AGREEMENT

for

Baccalaureate Degree in Education
offered collaboratively by
MONTANA STATE UNIVERSITY – NORTHERN
and
FORT PECK COMMUNITY COLLEGE

SCOPE OF THE PROGRAM: Montana State University – Northern and Fort Peck Community College, will establish a collaborative degree completion program, leading to a Bachelor of Science Degree in Education for Elementary Education. The degree will be conferred by MSU- Northern.

PROGRAM DATES: The program will be offered beginning January 2014.

LENGTH OF AGREEMENT: The parties to this agreement will commit to offering this program until all courses required for completion of the MSU – Northern major in Elementary Education have been offered at least one time each within the Teachers of Native Nations Project timeline of 2014-2016. The articulation agreement between FPCC and MSU-Northern will be reviewed and reaffirmed in 2016.

NAME OF THE PROGRAM: FPCC Education Degree Completion Program

TRANSCRIPTS: Once the students are accepted at MSU-Northern all courses will be placed on MSU-Northern transcripts.

EDUCATIONAL PREPARATION: Fort Peck community college will offer general education courses and courses leading to an Associate of Arts Degree in Education.

Each student must complete the MSU-Northern requirements for entering the MSU-Northern Elementary Teacher education Program. These requirements include completion of PSCI 210 Introduction to American Government, HPE 235 Principles of Health and Wellness, M 121 College Algebra, M 130 Mathematics for Elementary Teachers I, WRIT 101 College Writing, SPCH 142 Fundamentals of Speech, PHSX 105 Fundamentals of Physical Science, PHSX 106 Fundamentals of Physical Science Lab, BIOB 160 Principles of Living Systems, BIOB 161 Principles of Living Systems Lab, PSYX 230 Developmental Psychology, HSTA 255 Montana History, NASX 105 Introduction to Native American Studies, LIT 110 Introduction to Literature, LIT 210 American Literature I, EDU 201 Foundations of Education, EDU 370 Integrating Technology in Education, and EDU 225 Introduction to Education Psychology and/or the equivalent courses offered at Fort Peck Community College as agreed elsewhere in this agreement. The student must also meet or exceed the minimum overall grade point average of 2.50 for both general education and professional core in education courses.

STAFFING: FORT PECK COMMUNITY COLLEGE will designate a Project Coordinator. A MSU-Northern will designate a part-time Project Coordinator. One of the Project Coordinator's duties will to help arrange for the supervision of student teachers.

FINANCIAL AID: For the purpose of financial aid, all students enrolled in this baccalaureate degree completion program in Education will be considered students of MSU-Northern and will be eligible to apply for financial assistance at MSU-Northern. The MSU-Northern visiting Student Consortium Agreement is by reference incorporated into this agreement.

COURSE ARTICULATION: MSU-Northern will accept the courses listed herein that are offered at Fort Peck Community College as substitutions for the courses offered at MSU-Northern.

COURSE SCHEDULING: Courses offered in the Baccalaureate Education Degree Completion Program will feature a varied delivery format, that may include on-aite instruction, modular courses offered through distance delivery technologies, and courses which may combine more than one method of delivery. The MSU-Northern Project Coordinator, in conjunction with the Teachers of Native Nations Project (FPCC), and teaching faculty in Education, will coordinate all courses to be scheduled in a timely manner prior to the beginning of each semester. Students will be required to be on campus, at MSU-Northern, during the summer for 5-8 weeks.

COURSE TEXTBOOKS: Textbooks may be purchased through the MSU-Northern bookstore, the FPCC bookstore, or online. The designated MSU-Northern Education Project Coordinator will be the primary point of contact for information on textbooks.

ENTIRE AGREEMENT: This articulation agreement replaces all previous agreements and comprises the entire agreement concerning the Baccalaureate Degree Completion Program in Education Program between MSU-Northern and Fort Peck Community College.
