CLASSES FOR CECs

The 86th Annual Fall Water School will be held in Bozeman, **October 8—10, 2019**, at Montana State University. Attendance at Water School may be used to satisfy continuing education credit (CEC) renewal requirements for water and wastewater operator certifications, sanitarians, engineers and well drillers. Water and wastewater operator examinations will be administered by DEQ's Certification office.

Two to five tracks will run concurrently for water and wastewater system operators/managers. It will be up to the individual to select classes pertinent to his or her professional or system needs. Some classes will be joint sessions as they apply to both water and wastewater systems. Up to 2.250 CECs will be available.

CERTIFICATION REVIEW SESSIONS for NEW WATER and WASTEWATER OPERATORS

****REGISTER TO ATTEND CERTIFICATION REVIEW SESSIONS BY SENDING THIS REGISTRATION FORM & PAYMENT TO METC.**

The Certification Review is designed for entry-level operators who plan to take the certification exam either at the end of Water School or in the near future. The review sessions are designed as a supplement to individual study and although should be of significant value to those taking an exam must not be the only preparation an operator does for an exam. Classes offered will include:

>Scientific Terms >Mathematics >Lagoons >Regulations
>Sampling >Groundwater >Surface Water >Mechanical WWTP

Entry-level operators who have not yet taken the exam are not required to obtain continuing education credits (CEC's). So no CEC's are offered for the Certification Review. **Please bring your study materials and a calculator.**

CERTIFICATION EXAMS

The Montana DEQ Operator Certification Office will administer the certification examinations on Thursday afternoon October 10 from 1:00 to 5:00 PM, with registration beginning at 12:30 PM. The exams are for all classes of water and wastewater operator certification.

New applicants wishing to take an exam at Fall Water School must first submit a completed Application for Certification as a Water and/or Wastewater Operator (\$70 application fee) to the DEQ Operator Certification Office in Helena by September 11, 2019. Then must register with DEQ (\$70 registration fee) no later than September 26, 2019 to take an exam at Fall Water School.
