## Computer Corner

### Microsoft Office Tip: A new use for the mouse wheel in Office 2007 and 2010

If you're using Office 2007 or Office 2010, there's a mouse wheel trick you might not be aware of: you can move through the tabs using your mouse wheel. Hover the mouse over the Office button or one of the tabs. Then slowly roll your mouse wheel.

- Roll the wheel back to browse to the right.
- Roll the wheel forward to browse to the left.

Ok, "Big deal" you think... but this new behavior grows on you. It's an almost no-effort way to take a quick peek at the options on each tab. Use it when you're looking for something and can't remember what tab it's on. It's more efficient than clicking each tab!

Neither the Office button in 2007 nor the File tab in 2010 is in the cycle. You must click those to access their features and options.
