Pre-Register for Summer and Fall Semesters

Northern Students, pre-registration for the summer and fall semesters begins soon! All students can pre-register for the summer semester on Monday, March 8.

Graduate students may register at any time beginning April 4. Undergraduate pre-registration for the fall semester is specific to each student's class standing (your class standing does not include spring semester classes).

- *SENIORS (Sem. Cr. Earned: 90 or above) pre-register Monday, April 4 any time after 8:00 a.m.
- *JUNIORS (Sem. Cr. Earned: 60-89) pre-register Tuesday, April 5 any time after 8:00 a.m.
- *SOPHOMORES (Sem. Cr. Earned: 30-59) pre-register Wednesday, April 6 any time after 8:00 a.m.
- *FRESHMEN (Sem. Cr. Earned: 0-29) pre-register Thursday, April 7 any time after 8:00 a.m.
- *NEW STUDENTS Monday, April 11 any time after 8:00 a.m.

Open registration will continue until the first day of classes.

Blood Drive

March is Red Cross Month. On Wednesday, March 9th, the American Red Cross will be here from 11:00 AM to 4:00 PM at the Student Union Building for our Spring Blood Drive. For the blood drive, identification will be required. You may sign up by calling 1-800-RED-CROSS or you may go to redcrossblood.org. or call Jamie Smith RN at Student Health Services 265-3599. Donating is easy. It only takes about an hour; the actual donation procedure itself usually takes less than 10 minutes. It is best to have an appointment to cut down on waiting time but walk-ins are welcome. You can donate whole blood every 56 days. The average adult body holds 10-12 pints of blood, but a donation consists of about one pint. If there is anyone who wishes to donate their time in helping check in donors or with refreshments, please contact Jamie. This is an excellent way to help if you are squeamish about donating. Any help would be greatly appreciated.

Before donating:

- 1. Get a good night's sleep.
- 2. Have a good breakfast or lunch.
- 3. Drink extra water and fluids to replace the volume you will donate (avoid tea, coffee, or other beverages with caffeine).
- 4. Eat iron-rich foods: red meat, fish, poultry, beans, iron-fortified cereals, raisins or prunes.
- 5. Avoid fatty foods such as hamburgers, fries or ice cream before donating.

During donation:

- 1. Wear clothing with sleeves that can be raised above the elbow.
- 2. Relax.

After the donation:

- 1. Rehydrate by drinking plenty of fluids over the next 24-48 hours.
- 2. Avoid strenuous physical activity or heavy lifting for about five hours after donation.
- 3. If you feel light headed, lie down, preferably with feet elevated, until the feeling passes.
- 4. Take the time to enjoy a snack and a drink in the refreshments area immediately after donating.

Dean EASN Candidates to Visit Northern Campus

Two Dean EASN candidates will be on campus Friday, March 11 for interviews. They are Dr. Susan Muller of Salisbury, MD, and Dr. Tim Rees of Loveland, CO.

Dr. Susan Muller graduated from Edinboro University of Pennsylvania with a BS degree in Health and Physical Education and a second BS in Biological Science. In addition, she received both an MA and PhD in Health Education from the University of Maryland. Most recently, Dr. Muller has served as the

Chair of the Department of Health & Sports Sciences at Salisbury University in Salisbury, MD. In this role she is responsible for managing budgets, as well as the recruitment, evaluation, and mentoring of faculty and staff. She has also served as Professor, NCATE Coordinator, and Faculty Wellness Coordinator. She has been involved in both curriculum development and new program development including an Exercise Science Major, Masters in Applied Health Physiology, and a Health Education Program. Awards include the Salisbury University Distinguished Faculty Award. Dr. Muller has published extensively on such topics as wellness, essentials of exercise physiology, body image, communicating effectively, and fostering resiliency. She has nine years of teaching experience at the K-12 level and 20 years of college teaching experience. There will be an open forum with Dr. Susan Muller at 11:00 a.m. in the Hensler Auditorium.

Dr. Tim Rees graduated from Ohio State University with a BSEE degree, an MBA from Colorado State University, and a JD in Law from the University of Denver. He is currently the Multi-Campus Dean at Aims Community College in Loveland, CO. Under his leadership, FTE enrollment has increased by more than 25% annually and retention to over 70%. Prior to Aims Community College, Dr. Rees served as the Vice President/Campus Director at the University of Phoenix in Seattle, WA. In this position, he worked closely with the regulatory boards, Department of Education, Alumni Network, Chamber of Commerce, city government, and local businesses. From 1983-2002, Dr. Rees was the General Manager of International Training and Education with Hewlett Packard in Fort Collins, CO. In this role, he launched HP Centers of Learning in conjunction with local governments and funding from business partners in China, Germany, Taiwan, France, and Amsterdam. View non-consecutive dates in Outlook's Calendar

Outlook's Calendar display is familiar to us. When you view a week or month, you see all the days in order for that time period. This is the display most of us need. But occasionally you might want to view non-consecutive dates. There is no view for that, but you can create one:

- When you are in the Calendar view, the Date Navigator is the set of little calendars found in the right hand column.
 (If you don't see the Date Navigator you can display it: For Outlook 2010, click the View tab, and then click Navigation Pane in the Layout group and choose Normal. In Outlook 2003 and 2007, click View then Navigation Pane and then select Normal from the resulting submenu)
- 2. Click on the first date you want to view in the Date Navigator.
- 3. Hold down the **Ctrl** key and click the other dates you wish to view.

As you click the dates, Outlook adds them to the display panel. (Note: Outlook will display the dates in consecutive order, not the order you click them)

As the Northern wrestling team heads into the 54th National NAIA Wrestling Championships, it is worth noting how successful and consistent the Lights wrestling team has been over the past three decades. Here are a few numbers to back that up. Northern has had at least one All-American (place in the top eight) every year for the past 29 years. In fact, for the past 27 years, Northern has had at least two All-American (place in the top eight). Northern has more NAIA National team championships than any other current NAIA school and only one current NAIA school has more individual National Champions than Northern (Simon Fraser has 40 compared to 29 for Northern).

This year Northern will be sending five freshman, two sophomores, two juniors and one senior to the National Tournament. These ten student/athletes have accumulated 208 wins this season.
