### From the Chancellor

In previous comments, both publicly and in print, I have emphasized the importance of strategic marketing of our institution, focusing on our strengths and emphasizing our distinctiveness in a way that resonates with potential students. We also must develop a better understanding of the message that we are sending to our many publics: students, potential students, faculty, staff, community, alumni, donors, legislators, etc. To that end, a core marketing working group (Tracey Jette, Tiffany Van Heel, Jim Potter, and I, with plans to expand membership at a later date) has been convened to begin the initial task of creating a focused marketing strategy revolving around specific academic programs. The Academic Council has been asked to identify specific programs to highlight in a marketing initiative based on uniqueness, reputation, and capacity for growth. Additionally, Ms. Sue Ost has increased the university's marketing budget to provide more financial support for targeted initiatives.

For those of you interested in further exploring marketing within higher education, I offer for your perusal two articles representative of the writing and research in the field: "Know Thyself: Five Strategies for Marketing a College" and "Promoting the Academy: The Challenges of Marketing Higher Education." Also, a recent article in the daily newsletter "Inside Higher Education" provides additional insight into the influence and power of social media in marketing efforts.

- After review of the report, the Chancellor's Council will discuss the costs of a full upgrade within the context of institutional priorities for provision of both educational and recreational facilities.

Until further notice, however, the climbing wall and ropes course will continue to be closed and inaccessible for any event-academic, recreational, or community-related.

The Northern Showcase Concert Association is proud to present as their season opener "James Lee Stanley" on October 9, 2012 at 7:30 p.m. in the MSU-Northern SUB Ballroom. Stanley, a true renaissance man, was born into a musical family in Philadephia, PA., and was already performing and recording for LeGrand Records by the time he was fourteen. He majored in music at California State University, did a stint in the Air Force as a Chinese linguist, and performed three hundred dates a year with such diverse acts as Bonnie Raitt, Robin Williams, Chick Corea & Return to Forever, and Bill Cosby by the time he landed his second recording contract.

Stanley is one of the few all-time greats and undisputed geniuses among singer-songwriters. FI Magazine listed his "Freelance Human Being" as "one of the finest recordings of 1998 and one of the Top 200 Recordings of all time." -FI Magazine-March 1999

There are two wonderful opportunities for students, faculty, staff, and community members to expand their horizons with overseas travel in 2013.

First, over spring break, March 10-18, a group is leaving from Great Falls and heading to explore Ireland with an escorted tour. The trip starts in Shannon/Killarney then heads south to the Ring of Kerry, east to Blarney and Cork, then north to Dublin where they will experience St. Patrick's Day. The second opportunity is to Turkey. Brenda Skornogoski is the group leader. The group leaves Great Falls May the 14th for a 13-day adventure that circumnavigates Turkey. The tour starts in Istanbul, continues through Troy to Izmir (also known as Smyrna) with an optional side trip to Ephesus and the last home of Mary of Nazareth. The trip continues to Anatalya which is located on the Mediterranean Sea. This area is referred to as the "Turquoise Coast". From there the tour goes to Cappadocia which is an area similar to our "Badlands" with very unique building structure - sort of like our local "hoodoos". 

# Word 2010 Tip How to prefix a numbered list in Word

It's easy to create a numbered list in Word. You enter the list items, select them, and click **Numbering** in the **Paragraph** group on the **Home** tab. It's quick and easy. Thanks to all the numbering options, you have a lot of control over sequence and format. Another thing that you can also do quite easily is prefix each number with descriptive text. To illustrate this easy-to-implement technique, we'll create a simple list and prefix each number with the text "Flower". To create this prefixed list:

- 1. Enter the list items.
- Select the list.
- Click Numbering in the Paragraph group on the Home tab. At this point, you have a simple numbered list.
- 4. Select the numbers. You can do this by clicking any of the numbers and Word will highlight the entire list. If any of the list items are selected, try again.
- 5. Right-click the highlighted numbers, then select (but don't click) **Numbering** and then choose **Define New Number Format**.
- 6. In the resulting dialog box, add "Flower " to the Number Format control enter it to the left

of the existing number. Be sure to include a space after Flower to separate the text from the number.

7. Click OK.

**NOTE**: This setting will stay in effect until you change it for this document. That means, the next numbered list that you create will also have the text prefix. To switch back to a standard numbering format just repeat steps 4 and 5 but instead of defining a new number format, simply click the numbered list style you want to use. You can also close and reopen the document to reset the option.
