



Here's a little about the P.E.O.: it was one of the first societies run by and for women. Seven students from lowa Wesleyan College at Mount Pleasant founded the organization on January 21, 1869. Over the years the society has grown to include nearly a quarter of a million members including off campus members. The P.E.O. mission has stayed strong and true throughout the decades, as the women promote opportunities for women. The women provide these opportunities through six philanthropies, one of which is Cottey College (a women's college with two-year and various four-year programs). They also provide the P.E.O. Educational Loan Fund, P.E.O. International Peace Scholarship Fund, P.E.O. Program for Continuing Education, P.E.O. Scholar Awards, and P.E.O. STAR Scholarship. Northern To Test Emergency Notification System - Jan. 27

Next Monday, January 27, MSU-Northern is going to conduct a test of our Emergency Notification System. You should expect to see:

- A TEST message to your campus and preferred email accounts.
- If you have a cellphone number in our Banner computer system you should receive a text message.
- All campus computers will display a message over anything you are doing on your computer.
- Your campus phone will ring and you will receive a voice mail message notifying you of the test.
- A notice will be posted on our website.
- A notice will be posted on our Facebook page.

These notifications may not come in this order and they will not happen simultaneously. It could easily take 10-15 minutes for each of the independent systems to get through their distribution lists.

The messages you will receive will all be a variation of this statement:

"This is a TEST of the MSUN Emergency Notification System. If this had been an actual emergency, you would have been instructed to take appropriate actions."

It is very important that you receive at least one if not several of these notices. If you do not receive a notification, please contact our ITS help desk at 265-3765. Thank you for your help with this test.



The Lights basketball team split two games on the road last weekend. They beat Montana Tech in double overtime 83-82 and lost to Carroll College 56-47. After the weekend, the Lights stand at 4-3 in conference play and 16-5 overall. The Lights are in a four way tie for fourth place in the Frontier Conference standings. The Lights will play nationally ranked University of Great Falls this Friday night in the Armory. Tipoff is set for 8 p.m.

The Skylights basketball team beat Montana Tech 58-42 and lost to Carroll College 66-60 last weekend. The Skylights stand at 5-2 in conference play and 15-4 overall. They currently sit in third place in the Frontier Conference. In the latest NAIA National Poll, the Skylights fell two spots to #17 in the nation. The Skylights will play the University of Great Falls Friday night in the Armory; tipoff is set for 6 p.m. The Lights wrestling team hosted a dual meet against Western Wyoming Community College last Saturday night and won the dual 32-17. Results for this and other wrestling matches can be found on the MSU-Northern athletic website under schedule/results tab of the wrestling home page. The Lights are currently ranked #3 in the nation and will be in Powell, WY on Friday night for a dual meet against Northwest College. First match is set for 7 p.m.

Word 2013 Creating Booklets

Creating booklets with Microsoft Word 2013 is simple.

- 1. Start Word 2013 and open a blank document that will become your booklet
- 2. Click File then Print
- 3. At the bottom of the printer options click Page Setup
- 4. In the **Page Setup** window, in the **Pages** section, select **Book fold** from the **Multiple pages** options.
- 5. Below that, make sure **Sheets per booklet** is set to **All**.
- 6. Now set the **Gutter** to the size you want. The gutter is the distance between your content and where you will fold your booklet.
- 7. Click OK.

Then you can create the booklet itself. In Word 2010 you had to make sure you had the pages right yourself, but Word 2013 will arrange them for you. So you can simply paste or write your content and Word 2013 will make sure things are properly arranged. This is a great new feature that's not just handy but actually saves time.

Once your content is ready to print Click **File**, then **Print**. If your printer can print on both sides, then just go ahead and print out your booklet. If it doesn't, then you'll need to select **Print One Sided** under **Pages**, and then select **Manually Print on Both Sides**.

If you're looking at making professional and stylish brochures or other booklet types, you might want to check out <u>Microsoft's free templates</u>.

@ Your Library

Researchers-looking for serious databases to use when doing research in your field? Check out the library's collection of databases. We have several that are designed for people doing research in scientific, technical, medical, social sciences or humanities fields. In the science and technical fields try the IEEE Xplore Digital Library. Included here are journals, conference proceedings, technical standards, ebooks and education courses published by the Institute of Electrical & Electronics Engineers. SpringerLink includes citations and full text articles and book chapters from the medical, science, technology and business fields. Another major research database is the Web of Knowledge-which includes many scientific, social science and humanities citation indexes. These databases can be accessed from

<u>http://www.msun.edu/infotech/library/DbDescript.htm</u>. When searching from off campus, you will need to use your NetID username and password to access the databases. You can obtain copies of articles or books by submitting an Interlibrary Loan request.

Are you a Google Scholar user? If yes, here are some tips

A Pinch of Salt

Dr. Martin Luther King Jr.'s little-known Facts

I know that the national holiday commemorating Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. has passed, but recently my curiosity about King peaked, and I wondered if there were some facts that our history textbooks left out. I found a site called todayifoundout.com, and it included interesting tidbits about King. Now the article was submitted by a guest author, but it seems that many of the facts hold true when cross-referenced with alternate websites. Here are some of the points I found to be intriguing:

- Martin Luther King Sr. was originally known as Michael King, but he changed his name to honor the great theologian Martin Luther. Since Michael King Jr. was only two years old at the time, his father decided to change his name too, ultimately dubbing him Martin Luther King Jr.
- King was not the only person to die at the Lorraine Motel the day he was assassinated. The
 motel owner's wife Lorraine had a heart attack following the news of King's shooting. It is
 rumored that Lorraine's death caused the slow ambulance arrival for King because she was the
 switchboard operator; so when the emergency call for King was made, Lorraine was not
 conscious to make the connection.
- Stress played a major role in King's deteriorating health. Though he died at age 39, the autopsy revealed that he had a heart like a 60 year old man.
- King was the one who convinced the original actress (Nichelle Nichols) who portrayed "Uhura" on Star Trek to remain with the show after the first season. He encouraged her by pointing out that she had entered new territory by portraying a black woman who was intelligent and an equal to the others in the plot.
- King skipped two grades in school and started his post-secondary education at the age of 15 at Morehouse College.
