Kent came to Northern Montana College and graduated from Montana State University-Northern in 1995 with a Bachelor of Science Degree in Secondary Education, HPE K-12 major, Drama 5-12 minor. While a student at Northern Kent was the editor of the NoMoCo, the college student run newspaper. With that experience Kent worked at the Havre Daily News as their Sports Editor. But Kent wanted to get into teaching. After teaching Mathematics and Theater in the Jefferson Joint School District #251 in, Rigby, ID, Kent went to the Hubert Humphrey School of Public Policy at the University of Minnesota.
