The Health Promotion program also provides an excellent foundation for a career in physical therapy.

#### **Steel Magnolias Thrills Audiences**

The action is set in Truvy's Beauty Salon in Chinquapin, Louisiana, where all the ladies who are "anybody" come to have their hair done. Helped by her eager new assistant, Annelle (who is not sure whether or not she is still married), the outspoken, wise-cracking Truvy dispenses shampoos and free advice to the town's rich curmudgeon, Ouiser, an eccentric millionaire; Miss Clairee, who has a raging sweet tooth; and the local social leader, M'Lynn, whose daughter, Shelby (the prettiest girl in town), is about to marry a "good ole boy." Filled with hilarious repartee and not a few acerbic but humorously revealing verbal collisions, the play moves toward tragedy when, in the second act, the spunky Shelby (who is a diabetic) risks pregnancy and forfeits her life. The sudden realization of their mortality affects the others, but also draws on the underlying strength-and love-which gives the play, and its characters, the special quality to make them truly touching, funny, and marvelously amiable company in good times and bad.

Song of the Violin - By Jessica Henderson



The Office of Diversity Awareness and Multicultural Programs (ODAMP) is very pleased to have MSU-Northern staff member Jessica Henderson as the October artist of the month. Henderson is originally from Worcester, MA. She explains that at a very young age she discovered her love for drawing. Since she has always enjoyed art, when it was time to go to college, she decided to enroll at the New Hampshire Institute of Art, so she could refine her technical skills. She likes to use recycled materials for some of her creations "like broken furniture, bicycle wheels, or broken jewelry" she explains. Henderson has had pieces in exhibitions in several museums all over the New England area.

This piece, titled "Song of the Violin" is an 11" X 8" Acrylic painting. The violin is an instrument that is tied to many cultures. She elaborates, "Whether it is given or received, music is a gift. Violins create a sound longing for home-wishing for light. The violin is my heart's favorite storyteller. I can always understand its language."

#### FROM THE CAREER CENTER

The Montana State University-Northern Fall 2017 Career Fair is Monday, October 16, and will be held in the MSU-Northern Armory Gymnasium from 9 a.m. - Noon. The Career Fair is open to registered employers, all currently enrolled MSU-Northern students and alumni seeking various job opportunities. There will be employers interested in students from many academic programs offered at MSU-Northern. This event will give Northern students and alumni the chance to meet with employers from all over the United States.

The Fall 2017 Career Fair Gold Sponsors are Peterson CAT of Oregon, Modern Machinery of Missoula and Waste Solutions of Washington. There are also four Maroon Level Sponsors for this event; Torgersons LLC of Great Falls, Montana, Phillips County Hospital of Malta, Stillwater Mining of Columbus, and Mountain View Coop of Great Falls. These Maroon Level Sponsors receive tables near the front of the Gym, a half-page black and white ad in the Student Guide and some advertising.

Many of the companies attending the event are from Montana, however, many of them have job opportunities out-of-state. The Havre, and the surrounding community, businesses have always been supportive of Northern students. We are thankful that local businesses including Sweet Medical Center, Youth Dynamics, Havre Police Department, New Media Broadcasters and both USDA offices of Farm Service Agency and Natural Resources Conservation Services come to the fair each year. These important organizations help provide part-time employment for students while they are attending college and many offer full-time opportunities upon graduation.

About 30% of the employers registered for the fall event are interested in Northern's Agricultural Operations Technology (AOT) program. The Career Center believes there are several reasons for this interest, most of which is because the AOT program has had some extremely successful graduates move into very lucrative careers over the years. One spring 2017 graduate has secured a Field Representative position with Montana Congressman Greg Gianforte.

The Fair is only held the one day, but many employers will stay the afternoon and on Tuesday to conduct interviews with enrolled students and alumni for various internship and fulltime employment opportunities. Students and alumni interested in finding out which companies are interviewing and when the interview times are can log onto their *CareerExpress* account or contact the Career Center for more information.

All currently enrolled MSU-Northern students and alumni are welcome to attend the event and sign up for oncampus interviews. They will need to have a profile, with an edited resume, on the University's on-line career system called *CareerExpress* and are encouraged to register early for the Fair on that site.
