The Lights wrestling team is once again competing in the NAIA National Wrestling Championships this weekend in Des Moines, IA. The team has had an amazing season and they hope to bring back multiple All-Americans and National Champions. Bartel. Fifty-three teams will be competing in this year's national championship. MSU-Northern is third in the nation for the number of individual champions with 32. Brandon Weber will be one of five national champions who will be returning for the 2018 event.

Basketball Teams Compete in Playoffs

This week the 2018 Frontier Conference Basketball Playoffs started. This competition determines which teams will go on to nationals. Tuesday night (February 27) the fourth-seeded MSU-Northern Lights (19-11) and fifth-seeded Rocky Mountain College (17-13) went head to head in the Armory Gymnasium for the Frontier Conference quarterfinals. The Lights had already defeated Rocky three times this season. Rocky took an early lead over the Lights but they fought their way back. The Northern crowd pushed the team hard, but in the end, the Lights lost the game in the final seconds 73-72. Wednesday night the Skylights basketball team took on Montana Western in Dillion and lost 70 to 62. These games ended the season for the Lights and Skylights Basketball teams. Good effort teams-you make Northern proud.



Workshop Promotes a Respectful Manhood

This week MSU-Northern hosted a leadership session provided by the nationally recognized organization known as, "A Call to Men." Jeff Metsushita challenged men to a healthy, respectful manhood that prevents violence against women, sexual assault, harassment, bullying, and many other social ills. Attendees included over 60 faculty, students, and staff from across campus who were personally invited to participate by the Chancellor. By the end, 96% of participants stated they would recommend attending the session to others.

The idea to host the sessions was proposed by Emma Faust, a diesel student at Northern, along with her faculty advisor, Greg Clouse. As a female in a male-dominated program, Emma stated that she does a fair amount of mentoring of other women going into non-traditional fields. However, she recognized that the male faculty and students needed to be mentored as well, and empowered to speak up both for women and for themselves.

A second general session will be held on March 20, 4-6 p.m. in the SUB Ballroom, and will be open to the entire campus community.

Book Club Finishes Second Book

The book club sponsored by the English Department and the Multicultural Center met for discussion of the second book this year, *I, Tituba: Black Witch of Salem* by Maryse Condé. Faculty and staff discussed a range of topics: historical accuracy; the usefulness of epilogues in novels; symbolism; how this text might work in a classroom; and what made it an enjoyable reading experience. They will be meeting again in April to discuss the final novel of the semester. The book club is open to all students, staff, faculty, and community members.

"Historical and Intergenerational Trauma of Native Americans," will take place next Monday, March 5, at 3.00 pm in Hensler Auditorium. Deveraux (Salish and Blackfeet) has a BSW and was awarded the Indian Support Staff of the Year by the Montana Indian Education Association. MJ Desrosier (Blackfeet and Gros Ventre) is currently pursuing a BA in Philosophy with a minor in Environmental Studies. Both presenters have experience as community organizers and have been guest speakers

at a variety of lectures at the University of Montana, including Diverse U in the fall of 2017. This presentation is free and open to all.
