

Student Life Survey Helps Improve Campus Life

The results of the Student Life Survey, distributed to all students near the end of each fall and spring semesters, are in for fall 2018. We now have five semesters of results, which allow us to track our performance on behalf of students over time. The survey was distributed to all students using email addresses provided by students. Over the five semesters that we have been collecting these data, the number of responders has varied from as many as 356 to as few as 172. Although we would like to have more students respond, we are satisfied that these numbers provide sufficient student input to make the results worthwhile for us.


