# CJ Students Participate in Safety Patrol

At the beginning of the spring semester, the Criminal Justice Program offered its students who are majoring in criminal justice the opportunity to earn co-op credits as Student Safety Patrol. These individuals are

conducting foot patrol of the campus checking MSUN property for damage or loss, and assisting others. These individuals are also available to conduct safety escorts for anyone on campus.

The Student Safety Patrol operates as students schedules allow. Normally, operations are Monday through Friday from 1800 to 2300 (6:00 pm – 11:00 pm). The point of contact for escorts are through the SUB Information desk. The individual working the desk will contact the Student Safety Patrol of any request for a safety escort.

## **Women in Technical Fields Workshop**

They were exposed to many of the technical programs available in MSU-Northern's College of Technical Sciences. 
