Lights Defeat Argos in Quarterfinal Playoff Game



With the wrestling team at the National NAIA Wrestling Tournament this weekend, here is my annual "Northern Wrestling by the Numbers -2019 Edition"


521- Number of combined collegiate career wins by the 7 wrestlers heading to the 2019 National
