Message from the Chancellor

Spring break is upon us, and I hope that you are able to spend that time rejuvenating as we gear up for the rest of the semester. The health and safety of all our faculty, staff, and students is very important, and we have been monitoring the coronavirus outbreak very closely so that we can make decisions as necessary. We appreciate the guidance of the Commissioner's office on how best to implement the recommendations of the CDC, and have made the following decisions for the MSUN campus:

- Campus remains open. This includes the residence halls, food service, Financial Aid, Admissions, the Registrar's office, the library, the Student Union Building, and the rest of campus. The only change will be how students attend some of their classes.
- Per the Commissioner's direction, MSU-Northern is starting the processes of transitioning as many classes as possible to online and WebEx. Hands on labs and clinical will continue as usual.
- Students will be notified via email and Brightspace as classes make the transition.
- In accordance with the CDC's guidelines regarding social distancing, all large events of 20 attendees or more (outside of course labs) on MSU-Northern's campus have been cancelled/postponed through April 12.
- To safeguard our campus population, I am implementing a travel restriction on all campus-sponsored travel outside of the state through the end of the semester.
- We will continue to monitor the situation daily and will communicate any additional decisions or changes. Please visit our website www.msun.edu for updated information. We will also share news on all of our social channels, the NNN, and email as decisions are made.



Afraid of Friday the 13th?

Today is Friday the 13th, people who have an irrational fear of this date have a Frigga triskaidekaphobia. The term comes from the name Frigga who is the Norse goddess for whom Friday is named. Today, Friday, March 13, 2020, presents the first of two Friday the 13ths in 2020. Any calendar year has a minimum of one Friday the 13th, and a maximum of 3 Friday the 13ths. The last time we had only one Friday the 13th in a calendar year was in May 2016 and the next time won't be until August 2021. Three Friday the 13ths last took place in 2015 (February, March, November), and will next happen in 2026 (February, March, November). This year, 2020, has two Friday the 13ths: March and November.

TidBit Notes on the 2019-2020 Northern Wrestling season

With the wrestling season concluding last week at the National NAIA Wrestling Tournament, here are my TidBit notes on the season.

The three wrestlers who participated at the National Tournament represented Northern tremendously. Congratulations to Nick Kunz on winning his weight class and becoming the 33rd National Champion for Northern. Congratulations to Isaac Bartel for placing 2nd and becoming a three-time All-American for Northern. While Chase Short did not place, he did contribute to the teams' points and helped Northern secure a 12th place finish. This may not seem outstanding, it is when you realize that Northern only had three wrestlers competing. In fact, every team that placed ahead of Northern had more than twice the number of entrants as the Northern Lights.

Keep in mind that all three will be returning next year for their senior seasons. Nick and Chase are well within reach of 100 career next year, as they have 79 and career 84 career wins respectively. Isaac has 114 career wins and that places him 12 wins away from Turk Lords for 9th place all-time at Northern and 22 wins away from Tyson Thivierge for 4th all-time at Northern.

Northern has now had 39 consecutive years with at least one All-American and 37 consecutive years with at least two All-Americans. Also, for the past 37 years Northern has finished in the top 16 at the national tournament.

Great job Lights! Keep in mind that next year will be the 50th year for Northern wrestling.
