MSU-NORTHERN NEARS PHASE 1 FUNDRAISING GOAL WITH 2 MAJOR GIFTS



MSU-Northern announced that it received two major gifts this past week totaling \$250,000 in support of MSU-Northern's athletic facilities. The gifts were made to the MSU-Northern Foundation and came from two local sources: the Patrick family gifted \$200,000 and another anonymous donor contributed \$50,000. With the football construction for Phase 1 near completion, the fundraising has not stopped.

"This dream has come to life all thanks to private donors, so it is no surprise that these two gifts are from individuals who support Northern and its evolution," said MSU-Northern Chancellor Greg Kegel. "They understand that

investing in Northern and its campus is an investment in our students and our future."

Earn a Credit for a Weekly Radio Show

KNMC 90.1FM is your campus radio station located on the main level of the Student Union Building. Founded in 1954, KNMC is an all-volunteer radio station comprised of campus and community members who love music and connecting with the MSU-Northern campus and the surrounding community of Havre. Additionally, KNMC can be streamed to friends and family across the globe at msun.edu/knmc

This fall, KNMC is offering a course credit for MSU-Northern students. COMX-291 Radio Station Participation class is a one-credit course that provides students the opportunity to produce their own weekly radio show for credit. Through this course, students will learn the basic operations of a radio station, its equipment, and how to effectively communicate through the medium of radio. Students are able to select their favorite music and content for broadcast while abiding by current FCC broadcast guidelines. We also have student scholarships available for as much as \$3,000.

Students... Register to Vote

Federal law mandates that colleges and universities provide their enrolled students who are eligible to vote with voter registration forms in election years. This email contains a link to the Montana voter registration application form and links to helpful voter registration information. The upcoming elections for both federal and state offices occur Tuesday, Nov. 3, 2020.

If you are not yet registered to vote, the <u>Montana voter registration application</u> form is available online.

This website will allow you to confirm whether you are registered to vote in Montana.

Complete the Census

Please find below some important information about the 2020 Census from https://census.mt.gov/:

- If you have not yet completed the census, go to <u>https://census.mt.gov/</u> and follow the instructions to complete your census questionnaire. It's easy to do and only takes a few minutes!
- If you are a student going to college in Montana and living off campus, you should be counted as a Montana resident, because

unlike your on campus classmates, you haven't been counted through campus housing.

- The Census is a count of everyone residing in the United States: in all 50 states, Washington, D.C., and the U.S territories.
- It only takes 10 minutes to answer 9 simple questions that will shape your community for the next 10 years.
- Your response to the 2020 Census is safe, secure, confidential, and protected by federal law.

THE CENSUS: A SNAPSHOT FOR MONTANA

- Montana receives more than \$2 billion every year in federal funding that is allocated to our state based on census data.
- Census data affect your voice in Congress by determining how many seats each state will have in the U.S. House of Representatives.
 Projections show Montana could gain a U.S. House Representative in Congress with an accurate count.



The Sixth Annual Hill County Suicide Awareness Walk – Sept. 10

The Hill County Suicide Awareness Coalition will be hosting the 6th Annual Hill County Suicide Awareness Walk on Thursday, September 10th, which is also World Suicide Prevention Day. Due to COVID 19, organizers have decided to forego normal pre-event activities and instead are requesting participants to make their own shirts, bring memorials and signs that they have made at



home, attain their own honor beads, wear a mask and practice social distancing. The Coalition has made masks with their logo and this year's theme "Connect to Protect" that will be distributed at the walk. They ask that participants begin gathering at the clock tower south of Cowan Hall on the MSUN campus no earlier than 6:45 pm. Speakers will begin at 7:00 pm.

This year's keynote speaker is Darla Tyler-McSherry, a Big Sandy native who is the Director of Student Health Services at MSU-Billings and the founder of "Ask in Earnest" an advocacy group focused on increasing suicide awareness among rural farm and ranch communities. Darla shares her personal message of "ask in earnest" in preventing suicide in farming after her father took his life on their family farm in 2016. Members of the community will be invited to share their experiences with suicide following the keynote speaker. A gentle 1-mile walk will then convene in a path around the MSUN campus; it is accessible.

QPR Suicide Gatekeeper Training - Sept. 17 & 24

The Coalition is also sponsoring two virtual QPR Suicide Gatekeeper trainings during Suicide Awareness month. The training is about 90 minutes long and covers a variety of topics around suicide prevention, most importantly how to question, persuade and refer someone who may be suicidal. There are two sessions scheduled: Thursday September 17th 6:30-8:00pm and Thursday September 24th noon-1:30pm.
