### **Over 400 H.S. Students Visited MSU-Northern**



Over 400 high school students came to campus Thursday (Oct. 13), to take part in TekNoXpo and ShowCASE and look at the various programs at MSU-Northern. Students met in the gym at 8 am and were welcomed by MSU-Northern Chancellor Greg Kegel. Then they were divided into ten tracks so they could take part

in a series of hands on activities geared toward their interests and designed to demonstrate some of the aspects of our various programs. The following three stories will share some of the things that each of the colleges did with their groups.

# **TekNoXpo Pulls Out the Heavy Equipment**



This year The College of Technical Sciences brought back their very popular heavy equipment rodeo. Representatives from Wärtsilä North America were on hand to demonstrate their Wärtsilä engine. Adam Oser, Plant Manager for the Cedar Rapids division of Wabtec and Glogal Freight Services, brought in a brand new Shuttlewagon to demonstrate. These units are used all over the world to safely move railcars around the yard or in tight places where a normal locomotive engine could not go. This particular unit is able to move up to 25 loaded railcars. They also had representatives and demonstrations from Allied Steel. Students also had the opportunity to weld, bend electrical conduit, and learn about how drone are being use in agriculture.

#### ShowCASE Proved that CASE is the "Place"



The College of Arts Science and Education presented ShowCASE. Their professors demonstrated some of the hands-on activities including: acting, graphic design projects, math, creative writing, chemistry, biology, ceramics, education, and 3D printing. Criminal justice teamed up with the Border Patrol to demonstrate their drone and some of their crime fighting equipment.

# **College of Health Sciences Provided Certificates**



The Nursing program presented several practical training sessions. Professor Frank Zuccala helped students learn how to "Stop the Bleed." They provided certificates of completion for all who completed the session. Professor Kasthuri Udayakumar, with nursing students, did a variety of scenarios with manikins in the Simulation Lab. Professor Jenni Pula helped students learn some hand-washing techniques and listened to different heart and lung sounds with SAM3G and the other manikins.

The Health Science program led students through an experiment using measurements of rate of force on the development in skeletal muscles. They also conducted some Bod Pod tests. As part of the community health track of the Integrated Health Sciences degree, Tony Gryffin presented an exercise in reflective listening, through a two person "listening practice."




