Administrators from MSU-Northern attended the 113<sup>th</sup> Annual Meeting/Luncheon of the Havre Area Chamber of Commerce on Wednesday, January 18. The current board members were introduced and they shared some of the highlights from last year and their plans to grow and improve the chamber activities in 2023. The keynote speaker was Amber Hofstad, the CEO of Windrift Hill in Conrad, Montana. She shared the inspirational story of her family's business, which started with her mother Deena's dream of owning her own business. Deena Maier, who was an occupational therapist, saw people struggling with skin problems that medications didn't seem to help. She did some research and discovered that goat's milk was considered a great natural therapy for dry skin. She bought three goats and began making goat's milk soap in her kitchen. From that humble beginning they have grown to over 60 goats that are hand milked twice a day and produce soaps, oils, lotions and lip balms that ship all over the world.




## (#381) MSU-Northern Time Machine

One of Northern's hidden gems is the link to the Archives & Special Collections on the Vande Bogart Library page on the MSU-Northern website. From here one can access the Montana Memory Project and view old NoMoCo (and Northern Light) school papers, old Northern catalogs and the Northerner. The Northerner is

the Annual or the Yearbook that was published from 1953 until 2007.

Going back to the first Northerner <u>Northerner 1953 | Montana Memory Project</u> (<u>mtmemory.org</u>)

One can get a visual glimpse of Northern's past. Here is a picture of Pershing Hall that was in the 1953 Northerner.



Looking back at that very first Northerner you can see that there were three college basketball teams. The first team is the men's varsity basketball team.



The next team is noted as the Dims. The Northerner states, "The up and coming varsity Lights are these boys tabbed as the Dims."



The last team, is the girls' team, and they were referred to as the Bulbs!
