



Vanek Takes 7th and Siegel Takes 4th at Nationals

The 2023 NAIA National Wrestling Championships in Wichita, Kansas, are now in the history books. NaKoda Siegel is a two time All-American. Austin Vanek not only qualified for the NAIA National Championships as a freshman, but was also named an All-American.

174-No. 4 NaKoda Siegel fell against No. 1 Isaiah Luellen (GV) by a close decision 3-2. Siegel won against No. 10 Douglas Peppers (SEFL) by a decision 3-2 to push him to compete for third and fourth place. He lost against No. 2 Riley Smucker (Life) by a decision 6-4 to take 4th place.

184- Austin Vanek lost in his first match of the day against No. 7 Sawyer Hobbs (Providence) by a fall 2:07. Vanek won by a sudden victory 7-5 against Sam Irwin (REIN) to take 7th place.

Northern Spotlights Al Garver

The first person I want to feature in our new column is our Director of the Northern Alumni Foundation, Al Garver. Before coming to MSU-Northern, Al was a Chief Master Sergeant in the United States Air Force. Only about 1 percent of all enlisted individuals achieve that level (E-9) of rank. During his time in the military, he received numerous awards and decorations including Legion of Merit award, the Meritorious Service Medal with two oak leaf clusters, and the Air Force Commendation Medal with three oak leaf clusters. In 2002 he ran the Olympic torch in Billings. In 2008 he played in the main event of the World Series of Poker in Las Vegas.



During the past 40 years, he has served as an active-duty law enforcement specialist, the Senior Enlisted Reserve Historian assigned to Headquarters USAF at the Pentagon and multiple deployments all

over the world including an eight months deployment to Joint Base Balad, Iraq. He was also the Executive Director of the Enlisted Association of the National Guard of the United States (EANGUS). He also served as the State Command Chief Master Sergeant for the District of Columbia National Guard from July 2014 to March 2017.

ASMSUN Hosts Student Leadership Workshop

Students from various student clubs and organizations participated in a leadership workshop on Tuesday (Mar.7) in the SUB Ballroom. Facilitated by

Gallup Strengths Coach, Brent Olinger, students learned more about their individual talents and explored how they used them in various roles in their daily, particularly in their leadership roles on campus. Participants completed an assessment prior to the workshop. With results in hand, they reflected on their top 10 strengths, as they learned about the four strength themes (executing, influencing, relationship building, and strategic thinking), as well as the 34 strengths. This workshop was sponsored by ASMSUN Student Senate.

MSUN Staff Trains Community Organization

MSUN Safe Zone recently facilitated LGBTQ awareness and ally building training with staff and board members of the Boys and Girls Club of the Hi-Line. The training was requested by Executive Director, Tim Brurud, to help their staff continue to provide an environment that is safe, positive, and inclusive to all youth and teens in the community, a commitment that is central to the Boys and Girls Club of America. Facilitator and MSUN Counselor, Amber Spring, stressed that LGBTQ young people are at much higher risk for mental health issues and suicide than their peers. These rates have been increasing since the pandemic, particularly in states with anti-LGBTQ legislation, like Montana. Research has shown that when an LGBTQ youth has even one supportive adult, their risk of suicide significantly decreases. Thus, trainings like Safe Zone can literally save lives.

Donation boxes will be set up outside of Student Health Services in the SUB Monday through Friday from 8am-5pm during March 20-24.


The Community Center accepts donations for the Food Pantry, the Dress for Success program, and items students may need for residential living. Suggested items for the Food Pantry include: protein rich non-perishable or shelf stable items (peanut butter, canned beans, canned tuna or chicken), ingredients for easy meals (pasta, pasta sauce, rice, etc..) and ready-made meals (canned soups, stew, ramen noodles, cereal, boxed meals), and condiments. The Dress for Success program provides lightly used clothing for students for interviews, internships, and employment. Due to the variety of occupations our students work in, most items are appropriate including shoes, work boots, pants, polo's, blouses,

skirts, blazers, and jeans. Moving into an apartment for the first time can be expensive. The Community Center also takes donations for items needed in residential living such as small appliances, pots and pans, dishes, cleaning products, toiletries and hygiene products, bedding, bathroom towels, and the like.

(#388) Re-visiting the 1982 Northern Wrestling Team

With the conclusion of the 66th Annual NAIA National Wrestling Championships this past weekend, I thought it might be interesting to go back and look at the 25th Annual NAIA National Wrestling Championships.

In March of 1982, Northern had its very first three All-Americans. Byron Hallock, Joe Aline and Gerard Eichten. Byron finished the year with a 15-5-1 record, Gerard 15-3-

0 and Joe Aline had a 37-5-1 record. All three finished in 8th place. The top 8 placers in each weight class receive All-American designation.

As a team, Northern Montana College finished with 14.5 points, which placed them in 22nd place out of 70 teams. The March 6, 1982 Havre Daily News stated that Eichten "...wrestled the entire tournament with a separated shoulder sustained in practice...". In the same article, Northern coach Dave Greenwood stated, "It was a super tournament for us."

The significance of this tournament and the All-American designation for these three is that it began a streak of 42 consecutive years of having Northern having at least one All-American. This streak continued this year when Nakoda Siegel and Austin Vanek earned All-American status. Congratulations to Nakoda for finishing 4th and Austin for his 7th place finish.

Also, congratulations to Colin Silverthorn, Rylin Burns and Devin Crawford for being named 2022-23 Daktronics Scholar-Athletes.
