# Havre Festival Days (#396)

This weekend in Havre is the annual Festival Days Weekend. This event started in 1981. The May 19<sup>th</sup> edition of the Havre Daily News stated, "The Havre Area Chamber of Commerce is working to organize the First Annual Havre Festival Days on Sept. 18, 19 and 20." The

general chairman of the first Havre Festival Days was Havre businessman Clarke Richter. Who is the father of former Northern Staff member Johnathon Richter and former Northern student Jeff Richter.

# Chamber announces plans for 'Festival Days' here

The Havre Area Chamber of Commerce is working to organize the First Annual Havre Festival Days on Sept. 18, 19 and 20

"Those in Havre that remember the old days with the big bands and exciting parades ought to really enjoy this," Clarke Richter, general chairman for the festival, said.

Richter said participant and nonparticipant events throughout the city will take place during the three day festival The festival will coincide with the official opening of Northern Montana College, he said

"As far as we know, no other city in Montana has had a festival like this," -- Richter said. Retailer's reactions to the Festival have been very cooperative so far, he added.

An Ag Expo is scheduled the same

weekend at the Hill County Fairgrounds, according to Richter "Hotels will be booked for the wholeweekend because of all that's happening."

Fire Chief Norman Maze has been put in charge of the firefighter competition. Firefighters from other towns have reportedly already begun training for the competition, Richter said.

Mayor Norris J Hyatt has been put in charge of coordinating concessions for the three-day festival, he said. Dr Art Dolman is in charge of organizing a downtown street dance on Saturday night and Richter mentioned the possibility that there may be an auction at the dance as well

As stated in the article, this weekend was selected to coincide with the Official Opening of Northern Montana College. For those that do not know or remember, prior to 1994 Northern Montana College was on the quarter system and classes began toward the end of September.
