
MSU-Northern Announces New Library Director

Brown Bag Lecture - "Mo' Sherds Mo' Problems? The Use of Ceramics in Archaeological Investigations." – Dec. 7

Next week, MSU-N's Instruction, Research, & Faculty Development Committee, in partnership with OTLE, will continue its Fall 2023 Brown Bag Lecture Series with a presentation by Dr. Kyra Kaercher, Assistant Professor of Biology & General Science.

The event will be held on Thursday, December 7th from noon to 1:00pm in Hensler Auditorium/ATC. Sack lunches are provided but limited, so attendees are encouraged to RSVP for lunch by Tuesday, December 5th at https://www.msun.edu/otle/brownbag.aspx. The presentation is titled "Mo' Sherds Mo' Problems? The Use of Ceramics in Archaeological Investigations." Ceramics, because of their durability and preservation, play a pivotal role in archaeology as invaluable artifacts for understanding past cultures. These vessels offer insights into ancient technologies, trade networks, and social practices. Using sciences like geology and chemistry, we can look at the technology used to create these vessels, to better understand the people behind the ceramics. This presentation will focus on two case studies, the first from Dr. Kaercher's dissertation, focused on Islamic ceramics, and the second on her new project in Iraqi Kurdistan, the Rural Landscapes of Iron Age Imperial Mesopotamia.



With the fall sports season having come to an end, there are several student/athletes that should be

recognized. It is no small feat to be a college student and to perform at a high level both on the field/court and in the classroom.

This is Dylan Wampler's fourth All Conference team that he has been since arriving at Northern. He joins Bomont Somerfeld, Marc Samson, Don Saisbury and Stephen Silva as four time All-Conference performers. The most recent recipient prior to Dylan was Stephen Silva in 2012.

I may be a bit biased, but both Dylan and Nikolas should have been 1st Team All-Conference. Dylan was definitely one of the best defensive players in the conference. Nikolas is arguably one of the best punters in the entire NAIA. Montana Tech punter Andrew Amos received the nod for Frontier Conference 1st team All-Conference punter and Nikolas was named to the 2nd team. With the new system that the NAIA uses for statistics it hard to find all the stats for the special team performers in one place. In article on the buttesports.com website (November 20, 2023) The Montana Tech Sports information department stated that "...Almos, from Great Falls, led the league and the nation in punting averaging 44.3 yards per punt." The NAIA football team statistics page for MSU-Northern had Nikolas Hunchak with an average of 43.4. This comes out to an 11 inches per punt more for Andrew Amos over Nikolas Hunchak. But punting average is only one statistic of many that are tracked.

You be the judge by looking at the numbers. Total Punts Nikolas 79, Andrew 26; Total yardage Nikolas 3429, Andrew 1152; Longest punt Andrew 72, Andrew 67; Number punts inside the 20 yard line Nikolas 28, Andrew 17; Fair catches Nikolas 3, Andrew 3; Touch backs Nikolas 8, Andrew 4. Neither Nikolas or Andrew had one of their punts blocked this year. The fewest number of punts in a game for Nikolas was 5 (Arizona Christian) and the most was 11 (College of Idaho). In 9 of 10 games this year Nikolas had punts over 50 yards. By looking at these numbers Nikolas Hunchak should have been the Frontier Conference 1st Team All-Conference Punter.

On a side note Andrew Amos high school football coach at Great Falls High was former Northern Head Football Coach Mark Samson and his current head coach on Montana Tech is Northern Athletic Hall of Famer Kyle Samson.

Nikolas Hunchak set two school records this year. First was number of punts in a season with 79 breaking Don Saisbury record of 76 punts (2007). The second record he set was punting average in a season at 43.4, thus breaking the previous record of 41.6 yards also held by Don Saisbury (2007).

Congratulations to all the student/athletes who were recognized for the accomplishments.
