## MSU-Northern Participates in National African American Read-In



On Tuesday, Feb. 27, the Vande Bogart Library hosted a national read-in event in honor of Black History Month. Several people read from their favorite African American author or shared some of their favorite African American artwork. The library also had a display of African American works for people to review and read. This national initiative was established in 1990 by the Black Caucus of the National Council of Teachers of English to make literacy a significant part of Black History Month. To date, it has reached more than 6 million participants around the world.

The group took a tour of the campus and discussed the many ways MSU-Northern is working on workforce development.

Commerce Director Green assumed leadership of the agency in 2024 after serving in the Montana House of Representatives. He has extensive leadership experience in the private and public sectors, as well as a strong background in economic development, serving as executive director of Two Rivers Economic Development Authority, and as a leader with the Montana Economic Developers Association. Director Green later started and ran a small business, and oversaw maintenance and civil engineering for Burlington Northern Santa Fe and the Bureau of Land Management, respectively.

#### NOMINEE CRITERIA:

- Students must be willing to receive the award at an agreed-upon campus event (virtual, sporting, or otherwise) we are planning a student award reception in Student Affairs in April, where this award could be presented.
- All students currently enrolled in an MTCC institution are eligible for nomination.
- Selected nominees will be vetted by the Governor's staff. If the nominee does not meet the criteria, another nominee will be selected.

## Northern Wrestling by the Numbers - 2024 Edition

With the 67<sup>th</sup> Annual National NAIA National Wrestling Tournament coming up this weekend, here is my annual "Northern Wrestling by the Numbers – 2024 Edition".

1984- The year that Dr. Dave Greenwood was named the NAIA District 12 Coach of the Year.1983- Northern finished in 17<sup>th</sup> place at the NAIA National Tournament

1982- Northern placed 22<sup>nd</sup> at the NAIA National Tournament (out of 70 teams).

1976- The year that Dr. Dave Greenwood was named the Frontier Conference Wrestling Coach of the Year.

168- Number of career wins by Isaac Bartel placing him 1<sup>st</sup> all-time in Northern history

136- Number of wins by Tyson Thivierge as Northern Light wrestler (5<sup>th</sup> all-time in Northern history)

112- Number of career pins by former Northern Light Ethan Hinebauch (most in NAIA history)

92.6% - Turk Lord's career winning percentage here a Northern (126-10)

91.1% - Emmett Willson's career winning percentage here at Northern (163-16)

91.1% - Brian Hilt's career winning percentage here at Northern (51-5) from 1982-84

90.3%- Isaac Bartel's career winning percentage here at Northern (168-18) 54- Number of years Northern has had a wrestling team (began in the fall of 1970)

50- Number of wins by former Light Emmett Willson in 2004

42- Consecutive years, Northern has had at least one All-American

40- Consecutive years, Northern has had at least two All-Americans (top 8) 40- Consecutive years, Northern has finished in the top 16 at the national tournament (1984-2023)

38- Number of Academic All-Americans Northern has produced
