MSU-Northern Awarded \$50K OSP Seed Grant to Establish Office of Sponsored Programs

Montana State University-Northern (MSU-Northern) is pleased to announce that it has been awarded a \$50,000 OSP Seed Grant to begin establishing an Office of Sponsored Programs (OSP). Administered by the SuRE Resource Center at the University of Kentucky, this grant aims to support institutions like MSU-Northern in their efforts to enhance research infrastructure and foster research opportunities, specifically in (but not limited to) the biomedical and behavioral sciences.

The OSP Seed Grant, provided annually through a competitive application process, assists SuRE-qualified institutions in establishing or strengthening their research infrastructure. By establishing an OSP, institutions can better support faculty, increase grant submissions, and provide students with more opportunities to engage in research activities.

Student Senate Applications and Elections

ASMSUN Student Senate applications for spring elections opened on February 26th and will close on Friday March 22nd at noon. All four Executive Council positions (President, Vice President, Business Manager, and Administrative Assistant) and six At-Large Senate seats are open. To run for a senate seat, MSUN students must be enrolled in at least 1 credit and have paid the student activity fee. They must also be in good standing with the Dean of Students office. Students running for Executive Council positions must have served at least one term as a senator. Student elected into these positions will serve a 1-year term (summer 2024 - spring 2025) and will be inducted into office as part of the spring student recognition reception at the end of April.

Elections are scheduled to open online at 8:00am Monday March 25th and close on Friday March 29th at 4:00pm, provided 8% of the eligible student voters have cast their votes. The elections will be extended if the minimum number of votes is not met.

Each fall, elections are held for ASMSUN Senate along with Homecoming Royalty. At that time there will be three 1st-Year Student Senate seats and three At-Large Senate seats open.

Northern Alumni – Bob Feist

When having an e-mail conversation with Head Volleyball Coach, Jerry Wagner, I thought it would be interesting to go back in time to check out the NMC volleyball team when it began.

Last summer, I had a conversation with Northern Alumni, Robert "Bob" Feist about his time as the Head Women's Basketball Coach. It was during this conversation that he stated he was also the Head Women's Volleyball Coach for NMC. Bob confirmed recently that he was indeed the first Volleyball Coach for Northern Montana College. After he graduated from Northern in 1975 with a major in Physical Education (as per the 1975 Northerner), he accepted a teaching position in Canada where he also coached girls' basketball and volleyball. He stated that having coached both sports was why Northern hired him in 1976. For the 1976-77 school year Bob Feist coached both women's sports for Northern.

It was not easy finding much information about that first year. The "Northerner" (Northern's yearbook) did not even mention that there was a girls' volleyball team.

Here is an article that appeared in the October 21[,] 1976, edition of the Havre Daily News.

Girls Volleyball Nears End

The short volleyball season is near an end for the girls' first year at Northern. The girls are still improving, but time is running out.

Northern hosted a tournament here which featured Flathead Community College, Medicine Hat and Northern.

Northern got off to a quick start and won the first game under pressure, 16-14 against Flathead. Then they lost their momentum and lost the next three games.

The following day the players gained some valuable experience from a very fine Medicine Hat team. The team, however, failed to produce a victory and went down in three straight games.

Northern's main power came from Cathy Havskjold with some real good serves. Mona Wutzke also showed good planning.

Donna Mendell was out that weekend with muscle spasms in her legs but returned the following weekend to play at Billings.

On October 30th, the team drove to Billings. The girls showed good improvement and lots of fire when they played Eastern. Eastern won the first game but NMC came back to win the second game. Eastern then bounced back and won the third game which was delayed by a number of scoring confusions. The next match was against Western and the Skylights lost two straight.

Northern received fine serving from Diane Fusaro and good allaround performances from Donna Mendall and Cathy Havskjold.

Thank your Robert "Bob" Feist for being the first women's volleyball coach in Northern's history. At some point in the future, I will be highlighting other "long ago" Northern coaches.
