

Tech Snacks: OTLE Gadgets

OTLE has a wide variety of "gadgets" available for faculty to check out for various teaching purposes—from GoPro cameras to Wacom tablets. We'll introduce the equipment we have available and show some examples of how they have been used in the past to create different learning experiences.

Video creation

Cameras

Camcorder — general purpose, fair weather and indoors; can capture the instructor and computer screen (when screen recorder is not an option)

GoPros — Weather resistant, very versatile; GoPro 8 is stabilized

SoloShot — Outdoor only with tracking (needs wireless mic for good audio)

Osbot — Indoor only, uses tracking and hand signals for operation

Owl — Small room meetings and electronically tracks speakers

Computer accessories

Webcams

Graphics tablets — replaces mouse for better freehand drawing

Document camera — similar to a webcam but pointing down

Yeti microphones **USB** — plugs into desktop

ATR **USB/XLR microphone** — plugs into desktop or Zoom H6 recorder

Portable PAs — voice amplification with wired and wireless headsets
